A group of 4 GCSE Economics pupils in Year 11 recently entered a national competition run by the Bank of England. The remit was to create a 3-minute video on 'A Day in the Life of a Five Pound Note', as a means to celebrate the launch of the new plastic notes produced right here in Wigton. The team frantically put together their video called 'Planet Cash', where they created a parody of a natural history programme, hunting for the elusive new £5 notes in Wigton, the birth place of this new 'breed' of money. The team and I could be found roaming around Wigton, filming various scenes, including a mock-up of a mugging in Wigton car park to demonstrate the strength of the new notes, as a tussle for the money prevailed. I was greatly relieved that no one called the Police when they spotted one of our pupils, Callum Clarke, dressed up as a thief, right down to the black balaclava! The team members are to be commended for their efforts, not least because the filming had to take place in the busy season in the run up to their mock examinations. I was, therefore, delighted to hear that the team's submission was chosen as a national finalist, and whilst it did not win first place on this occasion, their submission was nominated as, 'highly commended', resulting in a trophy and certificate for the school, as well as their entry being posted on the Bank of England website in the 'Bank, Camera, Action' section.

So, congratulations must go to Madeline Stanford, Callum Clarke, Daniel Clark and Kyle Hall for going the extra mile to enter this competition alongside their studies!


Thinking forward...

Y12 Sutton Trust Summer Schools

The Sutton Trust Summer Schools are week-long residential courses where students get to experience university life. This can help students work out which university and course would be right for them.

Year 12 students who have at least 5 A grades at GCSE can apply. Students can choose from 11 leading universities including Cambridge, Durham, St Andrews, Edinburgh and Warwick. The Summer Schools are free. The cost of travel, accommodation and food is covered. Students need to nominate a teacher to verify their application – please let that teacher know in advance. The deadline is **Thursday 2nd March**. Please let Mrs Hudson or the Sixth-Form office staff know if you apply.

Christ's College, Cambridge, History Essay Competition

Christ's College, Cambridge, is pleased to invite entries for the 2017 History Essay Prize competition, open to all current Year 12 students.

The prize of £500 will be divided proportionately between the winners and runners-up.

You don't have to be studying History or intend to take History at university to be eligible to enter. Essays must be word-processed, no more than 2,500 words in length and should include a bibliography.

To enter, write an essay of no more than 2,500 words on one of the following:

- **Is historical research the friend or enemy of cultural memory?**
- **In what sense, if any, is history "the essence of innumerable biographies"?**
- **Should all historians aspire to influence a public?**
- **To what extent should the historian's method vary according to the period being studied?**
