KS3

Format	Purpose
A4 work booklets	<p>To record factual information and ideas in preparation for the mid-year and end of year assessments. Two key pieces in each booklet are marked in preparation for these assessments. One piece will be peer assessed and the other teacher assessed. Each piece will have clear comments on what went well (WWW) and what would need to be done to improve (EBI). The skills demonstrated in these pieces transfer directly to the assessments. Spelling corrections will be made on these pieces of up to 3 words (typically high-frequency or subject specific words). Booklets are taken home when homework is given. Each booklet covers a unit of work, typically based on 15 lessons.</p> <p>It may be that not every lesson is recorded in the booklets e.g. where there has been a discussion, or artistic/reflective work has taken place.</p>
A4 assessment folders	<p>Pupils complete two key assessments during each year; a mid-year assessment and an end of year assessment. These are given formal grades. Each piece is given a comment on what went well (WWW) and what needs to be done to improve (EBI). These folders remain in school and continue throughout Years 7-9.</p>

Format	Purpose
A4 folders	<p>Topic by topic notes to cover content, worksheets and homework. Mid-unit essays and end of unit assessments marked by teacher and contained within the folder.</p>

Format	Purpose
A4 folders	<p>Topic by topic notes to cover content. Worksheets and homework are included in the file. Mid-unit essays and end of unit assessments marked by teacher and contained within the folder.</p>
