



**New Staff/NQT's**

Induction of all new starters in E-Safety awareness via staff inset; briefing available on shared area.

New user agreement introduced September 2015-updated annually and to reflect GDPR September 2018.

**Systems**

Rigorous filtering systems in place via the school network. Removal of 'Bring your own devices' Sept. 2018. Use of the panic button. Case studies of intervention on misuse of systems.

3. All staff sign Laptop User Agreement.

Regularly reviews/discusses E-Safety within SMT.  
Attended RM E-Safety sessions & CEOP training update June 2015, June 2018.
5. Other staff-lunchtime supervisors training November 2018.
6. E-Safety discussed in Pastoral, Wellbeing and safeguarding committee. E-Safety Governor Mr David Murphy.
7. Cross curricular approaches to E-Safety; refer to departmental audit November 2018.
8. All NTS teachers and TAs Level 1 safeguarding training, a proportion with Level 2 and 3 training.

**Pastoral Intervention**

Rigorous and thorough investigation of E-Safety related incidents where impedes on behaviour of NTS. Log of E-Safety incidents held, including CPOMS monitoring. Reduced incidence of Facebook behaviour issues. Case studies available of effective practice. E-Safety covered within curriculum enrichment sessions for Years 7-11. Also in induction procedures for Key Stage 3 Computing lessons. 2017 mobile phone usage tightened between lessons

**Parents**

1. Informed about provision in school. Parent user agreement; all parents to sign. Procedures for failure to sign.
2. Website has parental meeting slide show, NSPCC links to information.
3. Annual meeting/info session for parents  
Up to 2016; post 2016 digital information provided.
4. Drop-in sessions with internet expert at selected parents evenings 2015/2016.
5. Parental links to E-Safety information via Parent mail and website-2017 onwards.
6. Regular reviews and updates of procedures; most recent to include GDPR regulations.
7. Pupil 'E-Safety ambassadors' engaging with parents at Parents Evenings-issuing advice and links to websites (October 2018).
8. E-safety targeted Parent Mail questionnaire November 2018.
9. Monthly E-Safety newsletter sent via Parent Mail.

**Students**

1. E-Safety Assemblies (All years annually)-E-Safety ambassadors led.
2. External Consultant drop in Advice
3. E-Safety sessions Key stage 3 ICT all classes
4. Information in planners on what to do.
5. PSHRE – coverage of E-Safety Programme 'Cyber Bully' Channel 4 for Year 10+11.
6. Students/parents to sign new policy with this read in tutor sessions at start of year. All pupils to sign agreement annually.
7. Details from the policy to be shown on log-in to school systems.

E-Safety ambassadors-role models for advice, conducting assemblies, parents' evenings.  
E-Safety information around school and on school TV screens. Peer mentors meet Year 6 pupils during summer transition interviews and discuss E-Safety issues. E-Safety ambassadors receive CEOP cascade training from Mr Beechey.
