

Religious Studies & Sociology Guide to Pupil Progress over time

KS3

Format	Purpose
A4 work booklets	<p>To record factual information and ideas in preparation for the end-of-unit tests and end-of-year exam. Booklets are checked for accuracy and quality of work produced. Exam style questions are contained in booklets in which pupils peer mark and respond to whole-class feedback. The skills demonstrated in these pieces transfer directly to the assessments. Spelling corrections will be made on these pieces of up to 3 words (typically high-frequency or subject specific words). Booklets are taken home when homework is given. Each booklet covers a unit of work, typically based on 15 lessons.</p> <p>It may be that not every lesson is recorded in the booklets e.g. where there has been a discussion, or artistic/reflective work has taken place.</p>
A4 assessment folders	<p>Pupils complete two key end-of-unit tests during each year as well as an end of year exam. The end-of-unit tests give specific areas for improvement in preparation for the end-of-year exam. These tests will have clear comments on what went well (www) and what would need to be done to improve (ebi). These folders remain in school and continue throughout Years 7-9.</p>

KS4

Format	Purpose
A4 folders	<p>Topic by topic notes to cover content, worksheets and homework. Mid-unit essays and end of unit assessments marked by teacher and contained within an assessment booklet.</p>

KS5

Format	Purpose
A4 folders	<p>Topic by topic notes to cover content. Worksheets and homework are included in the file. Mid-unit essays and end of unit assessments marked by teacher and contained within an assessment booklet.</p>
